Adult Studies

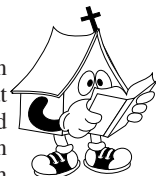
There are three opportunities for study being offered this fall:

The Work Of Our Boards

The Board of Trustees met on Thursday, September 08, before the Packers defeated the New Orleans Saints. Following are highlights of that meeting:

- The Treasurer's report was shared and approved. It was also approved to pay bills as money became available. As of the end of August our deficit was just under \$25,000. Our deficit is the lowest in the last 5 years and our expenses are the lowest in the last 5 years.
- Remodeling the old office is continuing to be discussed.
- Some things need fixing in the Fremont Street parsonage. This is being worked on.
- The mushroom light by lower parking lot will be looked at by Mike Bade.
- It was decided to purchase two more hearing aids for our weekend worship services
- It was decided to let Pastor Beth take the laptop that she has been using to North Dakota. Canaan Moravian does not have a computer and the first several years Beth was here she used her own computer rather than having the church purchase one.
- The next Trustees meeting will be held on October 13 at 6:30 p.m. The board will be meeting with Rev. Jim Hicks, president of the Western District on Thursday, September 22.

The **Board of Elders** met on Thursday, September 15. Following are highlights of that meeting:

- The request of transfer of membership to Canaan Moravian Church for Beth Rohn Habegger, Seth and Rhone Habegger effective Sunday, October 2, 2011 was approved.
- Jackie Frey will continue to work with our mini-Moravians. Bruce will hold an introductory meeting with any middle school youth that are interested on Wednesday, September 28 at 4 p.m.
- Rev. John Baumann will be filling the pulpit on October 1 and 2 while Bruce is attending the Lake Mills family retreat at Mt. Morris. Shirley Knapp will assist John if needed.
- Consecration Sunday will take place on the weekend of October 29 and 30. Ken Chandler, a lay member of the Hope Moravian Church, will be our special speaker.
- Since Bruce will be gone on November 12/13 we will celebrate Moravian Women's Sunday that weekend.

On the Sundays that he is not teaching he will float around the classes and drop in on the adult classes.
- Rev. Jane Harberg has agreed to oversee the adult education for the foreseeable future.
- We still have room for more people at the congregational retreat to be held September 30 through October 2 at Mt. Morris.
- Cindy Miller agreed to update the Joint Board pictures.
- Committee term limits were discussed and will be looked at in the future.
- We received 76 responses to our time and talent sheets. We need to do this again and encourage all people to fill one out.
- There will be homecoming tailgate party on Friday, Sept. 30. Wayne Staff will oversee this event.
- The next meeting was set for Thursday, October 20 at 6:30 p.m. There will be a joint board meeting with Western District President Rev. Jim Hicks on September 22 at 6:30 p.m.

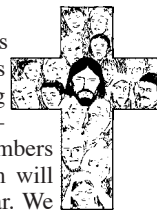

OUR COLLECTION WEEK WILL RUN FROM OCT.30TH – NOVEMBER 13TH

Operation Christmas Child brings joy and hope to children in desperate situations around the world through gift-filled shoe boxes and the Good News of God's love. Since 1993, more than 61 million shoe boxes have been packed, shipped, and delivered across the globe. People of all ages can be involved in this simple, hands-on mission's project while focusing on the true meaning of Christmas—Jesus Christ.



1. **Make it a Family Project!** Families can work together to create a box. Have each child create a box for a child of the same age and gender. Talk about the project, take a shopping trip together, pack and wrap the boxes, write letters together, enclose a family picture, and pray for the recipient and his/her family.
2. **Make it a Children's Project!** Have a few of your child's friends over and have an OCC wrapping party. Set out some items and wrap the boxes together. Write letters to the children, draw pictures for the children, pray for the children, and maybe enclose a photograph.
3. **Go shopping!** This may take some effort, but it sure would be fun and memorable. Give your child (and maybe have them bring a friend) \$5-\$7 and head out to a dollar store or inexpensive department store! There, purchase the necessary items for the boxes. You may want to even treat your students to breakfast or lunch following your shopping spree. Head back and prepare the boxes.
4. **Pray!** On Christmas Day, remember to pray for your child's safety, health, well-being, provision, and joy. Pray that children around the world would be open and receptive to the gospel that will be shared through the ministry of these shoeboxes.

Information about OCC, gift boxes to be filled and the collection box for donations will be in the entrance way by the church office. Monetary donations are always welcome and can be dropped off in the church office.

GIFT IDEAS

TOYS: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER: Hard candy and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

A PERSONAL NOTE: In a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. (If you include your name and address, the child may write back.)

DO NOT INCLUDE: Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
