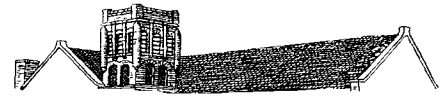

## The Work of Our Boards

The **Board of Trustees** met on Thursday, June 8. Following are highlights of that meeting:

- The treasurer's report showed that we continue to have a deficit of just under \$15,000 through the end of May. This is significantly better than previous years. Through the end of May, 2010 our deficit was nearly \$33,000 and the 2007 deficit at the end of May was nearly \$69,000.
- Our upper parking lot has developed some holes and this is being worked on.
- In getting ready for the mini music festival to be held here we will be moving pews out of the choir loft area in the Sanctuary.
- We will be receiving a WE energies money saving analysis on the church building and the Fremont Street parsonage. This can be done free of charge.
- A joyful noise offering will be taken in the near future to start a pastor's discretionary fund. This fund will be used to help with things like gas or groceries for those who are in need. The pastors will decide who will receive this help.

The **Board of Elders** met on Thursday, June 16. Following are highlights of that meeting:

- We approved the request to joining of the following members who would be joining the weekend of June 18/19. By reaffirmation of faith: Russell Butzine, Dale Koplín, Marlene Koplín, Pamela Koplín, Kari Jo Pauli, and Melissa Wilke; and by confirmation of faith – Nicole (Nikki) Lawson.
- We approved having the SWMM Lovefeast here on the afternoon of September 18. Our special speakers in worship that morning will be Mark and Glee Williams who work for MAF.
- There will be a music festival worship kickoff on Wednesday, July 20, and many of the festival participants will be with us in worship on Sunday, July 24.
- We have over 70 time and talent sheets returned. These will be collated soon and we will be referring to them.

## *A Personal Note From Pastor Bruce:* **To The Members and Friends Of Lake Mills Moravian Church**

I said very little to the congregation as you honored me with my 20th anniversary of ordination. 
