Discussions with Dave

I was driving from Marquardt Manor a few days ago and passed the tennis courts on Division St. It was a beautiful day and reminded me of the days of my youth. Right after high school I used to drive to Watertown almost every weekend to play tennis with a group of friends. I also played quite a bit at home in DeForest as well. At the time they built the new football stadium (1978 for those interested), they also put in two tennis courts. These courts had a high fence, so you didn't have to spend all your time chasing after tennis balls. They also put in lights! You put a quarter in a parking meter and the lights came on. I thought it was great.

It does not look like it now, but I played a lot of tennis. DeForest High School did not have a tennis team in those days. Competition was among friends and other acquaintances. That made it difficult to know how good I was. I won and lost to some good players. I took a tennis class in college (got an A) but didn't play again for about 15 years.

A young man about 20 thought it would be great to take me on when I was about 38 years old. I was a little rusty at first. But the young man was surprised that the more we played the better I got. Towards the end of our match I was hitting the ball to the left side of the court, and then the right. This caused him to have to run more than he expected. He began to get angry that I was doing this. I don't know if you know anything about tennis, but I believe the object of the game is to hit the ball so your opponent cannot hit it back. The purpose of playing the game was to win. My purpose in hitting the ball as I did was to win. Other players have done the same to me.

One of the questions I asked of the Discipleship Class on their first night was "What is the purpose of the church?" I suppose most of us have our own opinion regarding what is the purpose of a church, but do we know what the Bible has to say about it?

Using the Great Commandment of Jesus (Matthew 22:35-40, Mark 12:28-34), and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) and modeled by the first church in Jerusalem.

In Acts 2:42-47 five purposes are mentioned: They fellowshiped, educated each other, worshipped, ministered, and evangelized. "And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

1. Churches grow warmer through fellowship.
2. Churches grow deeper through discipleship.
3. Churches grow stronger through worship.
4. Churches grow broader through ministry.
5. Churches grow larger through evangelism.

Do these match up with what you thought? As the Body of Christ, the church is tasked with all these purposes. Not one, but all of them. A congregation specializing in only one or two of these risks letting the others falter, and in doing so may find they are not doing all they can to build up the Kingdom of God.

Another question for the Discipleship Students was concerning the work of the Pastor. The work of the Pastor is to teach, encourage, and challenge the people of the church to fulfill their purpose as a congregation. Will we accept this challenge? Only time will tell.

World Communion Sunday

Our next opportunity to come to the Lord's Table will be the weekend of October 5 and 6. It is a weekend when congregations the earth over will celebrate World Communion Sunday. According to the website of the National Council of Churches, World Communion Sunday began in 1936 in the Presbyterian Church and was adopted by the Federal Council of Churches (predecessor of the NCC) in 1940. Since then, it has grown into an international celebration of Christian unity.

The key word for World Communion Sunday is communion, or unity. It is a day when we mark the almost universal Christian practice of breaking bread with one another and remembering the night of Jesus' betrayal and His sacrifice. World Communion Sunday is a time for remembering that around the globe—in different languages, with different traditions and customs, and in various forms of liturgy—the Lord's Supper is celebrated throughout Christendom. While we may have different ways of serving and partaking of Holy Communion, we agree with other Christian traditions about our need to be united in Christ.

IPO Meeting

Another Celebration for Jerry Jenkins

On Sunday, October 6, our retired Senior Choir Director will receive The James V. Salzwedel Award for Excellence in Church Music from the Moravian Music Foundation.

From the Moravian Music Foundation's website: "This award was established in April 2004 focuses on Moravian music at the most immediate level: that of the music life of the congregation. Over the years, many musicians have given excellent and long-lasting service to music and worship in Moravian congregations. Recognition for these individuals affirms the vital importance of music in Moravian worship; the vital role played by accomplished musicians in leading the music programs in the congregations, in encouraging and supporting congregational song, in the development of musical skills for all members of a congregation, and in guiding young people in their musical and spiritual growth. While very few Moravian congregations have a staff member identified as "Minister of Music," Moravian worship practice for many centuries has included music as an integral part of worship, and thus the musical leaders of a congregation have a vital ministry in partnership with the ordained clergy. Recipients of the James V. Salzwedel Award will show significant contributions to the musical life of the congregation(s) they have served, over an extended period of time. While most will hold positions such as choir director, organist, or band director within a congregation (or be retired from such a position), it is possible that a volunteer member of a congregation's music program may have made such a significant contribution to that congregation's musical life that the award is clearly merited."
