## **Discussions with Dave**

The Letter

Almost thirty years ago as pastor of the Pittsville United Church of Christ (And the Veedum Moravian Church), I was asked to write a letter to the congregation on behalf of the Council (their version of the Joint Board). I had been there for 3-4 years by that time. For no reason other than doing ministry we had spent about half of their "Reserve Fund," which was money set aside for a rainy day. It was my task to tell the entire congregation about this matter. I spent the better part of a week writing, editing, and rewriting the letter. I wrote about ways people could easily increase their giving by only a little amount each week, and how it would make a drastic change in our budget by the end of the year. I gave all the rational reasons how and why we needed to increase giving. Many members of the congregation told me it was the best letter they had ever read concerning the budget.

But my views have changed dramatically since then. After a number of workshops and careful study I concluded it is far too simplistic to think in terms of "Amount of Budget divided by Number of Members equals how much we should all give." It is not only simplistic, but it is not the way God has chosen for us.

Scripture says we are to give a "tithe" or 10% of our wealth. "A tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the LORD; it is holy to the LORD" (Leviticus 27:30). Up until we shut down for Covid over two years ago, each of our worship services included a time for giving our "Tithes & Offerings." The tithe is 10%. Anything over and above that is an offering. Scripture mentions this is our obligation towards God who has created us and gave us all we have. Actually, God demands it. I know these are strong and harsh words for us. We like to live our lives making God who we want God to be and sometimes ignore those aspects of our faith which call us to a higher standard. Please remember...these are not my words...they are God's.

I have had people ask, "is that 10% before, or after taxes?" I tell them it is up to them. In reality, if people calculated what percentage they give now and increased it by 1%, we wouldn't know what to do with all the funds.

Giving is of course, just a part of one's faith journey, and there are many ways to give. The gift of time. The gift of talent. The gift of treasure. Time has become as valuable as treasure. When I wrote that letter 30 years ago, no one, including me, was as busy as people are today. There are times when I think "If someone adds one more thing to my calendar...." Putting talent to good use is difficult at times as well. I like to shovel the sidewalk, fix things, put out fires, etc. But my body no longer recovers as well as it used to when I was in my early thirties. I know I am not alone in feeling worn out a lot of the time. I think sometimes being a part of the church just becomes one more thing to do on the list of many.

My carefully worded letter of many years ago drew great reviews, but in the end it had absolutely no effect. However, by the time we left Pittsville in June of 2000 the "Reserve Fund" had twice as much in it than when had we started in 1990! What happened? God happened. Instead of asking people to look at our ministry as a business, they, and I, began looking at it as God's work and God working through us. They engaged in daily prayer for the work of the church, for God to work in their lives, and for God to work through them to reach others. Together we all changed our perspective on what it means to be a part of the Body of Christ. The humbling thing for me was to realize I had little to do with this change, but God worked in the hearts of those who call him Creator, Redeemer, and the Father of our Savior.

The million-dollar question is, what difference will this make in your life and faith journey? Will you be like those folks long ago? Will you read this and do nothing? Will you even read this? I pray you will open your heart to God's leading, whatever it may be.

## The Work of Our Boards

The **Board of Trustees** met on Thursday, December 8. Following are highlights of that meeting.

- the treasurer's report was given, showing a deficit of over \$56,000 as of November 30. It is hoped that this gap will be lessened by the end of the year.
- Mary Bade was appointed church treasurer for 2023.
- several changes to the Personnel Handbook were approved regarding paid holidays, vacation, and sick leave.
- several maintenance/repair issues were discussed.
- an AED that was donated to the church by the Lake Mills School District will be hung in the lower level near the Matthew Room.
- the proposed 2023 church budget was approved for forwarding to Church Council.
- Pastor Dave's 2023 Flexible Spending Allowance and Parsonage Allowance elections were approved.
- approval was given to dispose of church surplus items (Congregation members: please watch for a table in Fellowship Hall sometime after Christmas).
- the sanctuary Christmas tree and star will be taken down on January 4.

The **Board of Elders** met on Thursday, December 15. They also approved changes to the Personnel Handbook and approved the 2023 proposed budget for forwarding to Church Council.

## **LENT 2023**

Ash Wednesday begins the Season of Lent on February 22, 2023, with Mid-Week Lenten Services held each Wednesday thereafter until Holy Week.
